\$2,500,000 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

For more than 20 years, Atlantis Charter School has provided an education second-to-none to children in the Greater Fall River region. With its expansion to high school now complete, Atlantis will serve 1,400 students in Kindergarten through 12th grade. Atlantis's success is the result of our commitment to revitalizing and reinvigorating K-12 education through partnerships with our families, our city, local colleges and universities, and local businesses and industry.

Though charter schools are public schools, they are not eligible for public school construction subsidies. Since its inception, Atlantis has used its operating income to lease older, repurposed buildings that do not provide all of the needed resources and amenities for students. These buildings do not provide a gymnasium or athletic field; most of the classrooms are significantly smaller than traditional standards. Utility expenses for inefficient heating and cooling pull money away from student instruction.

After decades of strong fiscal management, Atlantis is finally able to finance the construction of a new campus that provides the educational and recreational space that all children deserve.

Atlantis Charter School's new K-12 campus will provide state-of-the-art educational facilities for 1,400 public school students, making Atlantis one of the largest charter schools in the state and one of the largest school systems in our region. We are excited to begin teaching in our new school, where students will benefit from purpose-built spaces, being all together on one campus and not spread across three buildings, and will have access to sufficient learning space to meet their needs.

We hope you will join us in making our new campus a reality and allowing Atlantis to operate debt free so that our dollars are invested directly in academics and enrichment.
